Senior Appreciation Day

The Buddhist Church of Oakland's annual Senior Appreciation Day (Keirokai) will be observed on Sunday, October 19, 2008 from 10 a.m. New Keiro members who have turned or will turn 75 years of age will be honored at the service. Also honored will be all the Keirokai members in attendance.

Following the service there will be picture taking of the new Keiro members and a group picture of all the Keirokai Members. Bento lunch will be provided to all Keirokai members.

Honoring our senior members is very important, but most are not aware of what the seniors had to go through to provide us with the temple that we presently have.

When the first generation came to this country and to Oakland, they came with a suitcase and the clothes on their backs. They began their lives here without funds, facing a hostile community, and having to eke out a livelihood doing back breaking work for less than minimal pay for their labor.

In the destitute lives that they were living, they longed for some connection with their loved ones in their home country to which they had no hopes of returning. The only thing that they could hold on to was the teaching of the Nembutsu. A teaching which connected them to their loved ones back home, but also gave them

the strength to live and persevere to find meaning for their lives.

The Nembutsu teaching was so important to them that they wanted to leave this simple religious life to their children who would continue to face the difficulties of living in America. They wanted to leave something tangible and meaningful for their children. They knew that this would be more valuable than material goods that they could not give to their children.

A hundred years ago it is said that the average hourly income was 22 cents an hour. That was for the general society living in America. Our pioneers probable received less than half that amount per month. Yet, they began the earnest task of leaving something tangible for their children and gave whatever they could from their earnings. They gave while many living a life of poverty because of their dreams to leave the Nembutsu teaching for future generations. It is a teaching which gave them comfort in the lonely and desperate times of their lives.

Senior Appreciation is a time when we reflect on the struggles of the past so that we can find meaning for our lives today.

Reflection: The struggle of the past is the foundation upon which we stand today. We need to be mindful of those struggles and find the meaning of gratitude for what we have received.

BCA 21st Century Campaign

The BCA 21st Century Campaign continues to go forward in an attempt to secure the future of Jodo Shinshu in America.

Since moving to the Jodo Shinshu Center, the IBS has enjoyed a growth in the number of students. At the August 15th Trustee Meeting it was announced that in the fall 2008 Semester, there are 14 IBS students and 29 students from the Graduate Theological Union attending Buddhist classes. There is the establishment of a chaplaincy program at IBS through association with two Buddhist Chaplain Centers. A major step has been taken to work toward the accreditation with the Western Association of Colleges and Universities.

The Center for Buddhist Education continues to develop strong programs for BCA members. In a month, four or five programs are presented with great response from the BCA membership at large. Programs for youth, Dharma School students and teachers, young

adults, temple leaders are being conducted.

There is activity and growth because the BCA has a campus which focuses and enhances the programs being conducted.

The members of the Buddhist Church of Oakland have always supported the educational programs of the BCA. Our church members have pledged/donated \$676,016.00 since the start of the BCA 21st Century Campaign. This total was achieved by the generous donation by 253 members out of 376 BCA members. That is 67.28% of our membership. Some members continue to donate over and above their original pledge. We are grateful to all the members who have contributed to the great cause of educational programs at the Jodo Shinshu Center.

The campaign continues. We ask all of our BCO members to participate in the great endeavor of securing the future of our Buddhist Teaching in the United States.

Nippongo Gakuen News

The Oakland Nippongo Gakuen will begin its Fall session on Saturday, September 13. The Japanese language program is focused on teaching Japanese to non-native speaking children generally from 1st grade through high school age. Classes are assigned by age level and Japanese language proficiency, with instruction tailored to individual students. Tuition is \$225 for the fall semester (September-December) and \$175 for each of the winter and spring semesters. Classes are held on Saturdays, from 9 am – 12 Noon, in the Issei Kaikan building.

The Gakuen also offers adult classes. The beginning adult class meets on Saturday mornings from 10:30 - 12 Noon. This class focuses on learning basic grammatical concepts and vocabulary, together with sharing cultural experiences and conversation. The advanced class meets weekly on Thursday evenings. Students are challenged to apply their skills to everyday conversational situations; e.g., talking on the telephone or ordering food in a restaurant. Learning to write is included in all the Gakuen classes. Tuition for either of the adult classes is \$125 for the fall semester and \$100 for each of the winter and spring semesters. Depending on the level of interest, additional adult classes may be considered.
