Anniversaries

his year marks several lacktriangle anniversaries for me. I had my appendix out in 1990. That same year I saw the band Phish for the first time while I was in college, and heard my first Dharma Talk, which sparked my interest in Buddhism. Now that I think about it, these all happened twenty years ago! And around the time that you read this article, I will be turning 40!

This is the perfect time to reflect on my life, whether the past twenty or the entire forty. I find it interesting that one of these events involves music, which has been such a major part of my life. Phish was one of my favorite bands, I saw a lot of their concerts during college and afterwards. I also played in a band myself during this time – in fact, I thought that this was what I wanted to do with my life.

But this was not the way things would turn out. The interest in Buddhism that was born out of that first Dharma Talk led me on a search, first to Japan, then to Rev. Taitetsu Unno in Northampton, Massachusetts, and then to Berkeley, California and the Institute of Buddhist Studies to begin my studies and training to become a minister.

Do I have any regrets? If I could go back and do it all over again, would I do anything differently? Maybe. I would try and be less shy. I would try and put more effort into school. I would try and have more confidence. But Buddhism isn't about reliving the past, it's about living NOW. Of course, the way I live my life now is affected by the past, but it is not determined by the past. The bonds of karma are incredibly strong and difficult to break, but Buddhism teaches that change is possible. By reflecting on my life, by being in a Buddhist community, by taking refuge in Amida Buddha, I am able to live a more "real" life – I won't become perfect, but maybe my normal self-centered way of being gets broken open a little bit, and truly living life, not only for myself but for my family and community and ultimately for all living beings becomes more of a reality.

President's Musings

T t's autumn and in the Bay Area Lthat means Indian Summer. After such a cool summer, we are now enjoying our brief and fleeting heat waves. Unlike the Central Valley or the rest of the country, our heat waves are only a couple/three days in length. And with each spike in temperatures, we all look forward in great anticipation to the return of that finger of fog that penetrates the Bay and provides our natural air conditioning. Within this climatic cycle of heat and fog, we enjoy our Northern California autumn: viewing the yellows, reds and browns in the ash, maples, gingko's and sycamores that

line our streets; enjoying football Saturdays in Memorial Stadium on the Cal campus, waiting in great anticipation if another year must pass before a Rose Bowl bid; the golden light of fall sunsets as the sun disappears behind the Golden Gate; Sunday Family Dharma services and our annual Keiro service honoring our members who are 75 and older - this year on October 24th.

With the beginning of the new school year our Dharma School is again holding classes every Sunday after the Family Dharma service. We encourage you to help us identify families who might be interested in bringing their children to Dharma School. If you know of anyone, please provide contact information to our Dharma School superintendent, Mrs. Maya Lawrence maya.lawrence@comcast. net We will use the information to send a personalized invitation to come and visit and experience our Dharma School and our family dharma services. Your efforts will help to strengthen our entire Sangha as new families bring new energy and new perspectives into the BCO community.

As you have noticed, the Roof Renovation project is well underway. Scaffolding remains around the building as the contractor finishes up work on installation of the molded GFRC (glass-fiber reinforced concrete) members that are replacing the former wood roof dragons and wood timbers that grace the peaks and

gables of the roof. The Contractor is also painting, replacing flashing, waterproofing critical joints and junctures, and replacing the membrane-roof over the Little Chapel. The Contractor's schedule has been extended as a result of the discovery of additional dry rot and previous construction that needed to be corrected. As of this writing, the work is about 60% complete and should be complete in October rather than at the beginning of September as initially planned. Parking and access will continue to be an issue as long as the scaffolding remains up. We will try to provide alternative means of ingress and egress from the church's parking lots during this period of construction. Please bear with us as the Contractor finishes this important renovation that will add to the beauty and longevity of the church.

On the Roof Renovation Campaign front, we received an additional \$8,580 in pledges and donations; and \$1,340 of payments on existing pledges through the month of August. Our Campaign total now stands at \$188,507, or 47.1% of our campaign goal of \$400,000. That's an additional 2.1% since last month's Busshin. Thank you to everyone who participated in the Obon lantern memorial tag program. We raised nearly \$3,000 through that program. I would like to especially acknowledge Brian Nagata and the Numata Center for the donation of the lanterns. The

Contractor has been submitting invoices at a rapid clip. We have been able to keep up payments with the donations that have to be made; however, we will shortly need to access other funds to cover the contractor's bills. For those who haven't yet contributed please consider doing so as we go into the last quarter of the year; take advantage of the tax benefits of making a contribution to the roof fund.

Finally, the Buddhist Church of Oakland has put into nomination, Mrs. Daisy Tsujimoto for the Kay Okamoto Award for Community Volunteer. Daisy has volunteered her time and energy in supporting the Church and its activities for more than 50 years. As stated in the Letter of Support from Mrs. Maya Tsuji Lawrence, "Daisy works competently, quietly with joy and cheer, without complaint or drama, and is a model to all in the Buddhist Church of Oakland." Among the many activities for which Mrs. Tsujimoto volunteers her time, the following were highlighted as part of the nomination:

- § Dharma School Teacher for 36 years
- § Altar Flower Arrangement Committee member for 14+ years
- § Oakland Jr. Women's Association / Buddhist Women's Association member for 50 years
- § Annual Nikkoland Bazaar Committee member for 12 years
- § Annual Obon Festival Committee member for 12 years

- § Community volunteer working with children with learning disabilities and visual impairment
- § JACL Membership Committee member

We look forward to the committee's decision. The awardee will be honored at the Japanese Community and Cultural Center of Northern California Tabemasho event on September 25th.
