



## Our Guide, Shinran Shonin

Birthdays are about beginnings, renewal, and celebration. In May, it is time again to celebrate the birth of Shinran Shonin, the founder of the Jodo Shinshu school of Buddhism, and to reflect on his birth, his life, and his legacy.

Shinran's early life was very difficult. Although it is thought that he was born into an aristocratic family, he became a monk on Mt. Hiei at the age of nine. If I really think about it, this is unimaginable to me. To have to leave one's family, to live on a cold mountain amongst unknown people in a monastic environment – it doesn't seem like something that I could do. But Shinran was not an ordinary person. On the first day that nine year old Shinran went to get ordained, it was evening, and his master suggested that they wait until the next day. In response, Shinran is said to have spontaneously composed the following verse:

We may think, I will view the cherry blossoms tomorrow,

But a storm might arise in the night.

It may seem unlikely that a nine year old could come up with something like this – many people probably consider this to be more

legendary than factual – and yet, if we look at Shinran Shonin's later accomplishments as an adult, perhaps it isn't so far-fetched. As a minister, I have been able to study the writings of Shinran, and even though they can be difficult, one still gets a strong sense of his deep insight, both into his own self as well as into the Buddha Dharma.

Maybe the best way to view Shinran Shonin is as a guide. His writings and teachings point to the core of the Mahayana Buddhist way of compassion. In his humility and deep self-reflection he gave us an example to follow. In his acknowledgement of his own arrogance and foolishness he revealed a path for ordinary people to truly walk the Buddhist path.

For our Fujimatsuri Service on Sunday, May 20, our guest speaker is **Candice Shibata**, a student at the Institute of Buddhist Studies, BCA Ministerial Aspirant, and Ministers Assistant for the Stockton Buddhist Temple. Come listen to the Dharma, spend time with our Dharma Family, and help us celebrate Shinran Shonin's birthday!
