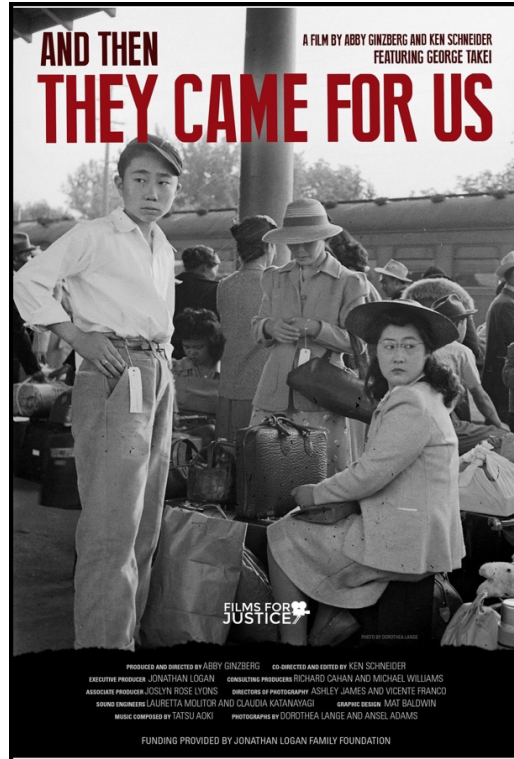




Sunday December 8th – 2 to 4pm Film Screening and Discussion



The film examines the painful history of Executive Order 9066 during World War II, which led to the incarceration of more than 120,000 Japanese Americans, including over 1,100 Berkeley residents. Discussion will be led by Japanese American curators of the Berkeley Historical Society's new exhibit, *Roots, Removal and Resistance: Japanese Americans in Berkeley*.

This award-winning 40-minute documentary film, directed by Berkeley filmmakers Abby Ginzberg and Ken Schneider and featuring Star Trek actor George Takei, came out in 2017 after Donald Trump became president the first time. It was called "a cautionary tale for these dark times."
